**Jaster-Quintanilla Lands Multiple Projects
in Tarrant County; Mid-Year Momentum Strong, Positive with
Firm's Expertise in Demand**

Dallas, TX, September 4, 2007 – Jaster-Quintanilla (JQ), whose Fort Worth office opened last month to accommodate growth in the market, has been engaged to perform engineering services on projects representing more than \$300 million in new construction activity in Tarrant County.

Among these are the firm's engineering work for the new 250,000 square-foot, multi-story, maximum security Tarrant County Jail which will be built on the site of the County's Muller Building on West Weatherford Street, across from the Tarrant County Corrections Center. A tunnel under the street will connect the new jail to the existing jail and courts. As part of a \$433 million bond package approved last year, the project has an estimated construction cost of \$75 million. Construction is slated to begin in 2009 with an anticipated completion date in 2012.

The firm has also been selected as structural engineer for the new Evangelism and Missions Building on the campus of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth. The building consists of a steel-framed structure with approximately 66,000 square feet for classrooms, gallery/lobby and administrative offices. Beck is the architect for the project.

JQ will also provide structural engineering services for the construction of a new 90,000 square-foot Chapel seating 2,800 at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, a \$27 million construction project with Beck as the architect.

At the University of Texas at Arlington (UTA), JQ will provide structural and civil engineering services and survey work, along with Yaggi Engineering, for the new Civil Engineering Laboratory. JQ is currently engaged in six projects for UTA.

In addition, JQ along with CDM have been engaged to provide engineering services for the Northwest Water Treatment Plant for the City of Fort Worth, a \$55 million project targeted for completion December 2010.

According to JQ's Fort Worth Associate and Structural Department Manager Rene Avila, P.E., "We are very excited about the development momentum in Fort Worth and Tarrant County. As a member of the teams that have been engaged for these various projects, we recognize the importance of delivering outstanding structural and civil engineering and surveying services in this fast-growing market."
